**Excerpted from the YINHP Holiday Journal  
Bikurei Torah, Shavuot 5771**

While Shavuot occurs annually at the end of the academic year, perhaps in unexpected ways, it also marks a new beginning of sorts. The Talmud (Rosh Hashana 16a) lists Shavuot as a "Day of Judgment" with respect to fruit production, in the very same context in which it describes the judgment process of Rosh Hashana proper, the traditional "New Year" of the Fall. Another passage (Megilla 31b) explicitly characterizes Shavuot as a "Rosh Hashana", and thus, by an enactment of Ezra the Scribe, we must read the "blessing and curses" of Leviticus (Bechukotai) shortly before Shavuot, just as we must read the parallel "blessing and curses" of Deuteronomy (Ki Tavo) before the classical Rosh Hashana. Indeed, still elsewhere the Talmud (Bava Batra 147a) identifies Shavuot as "barur" – exhibiting clarity – in that it somehow predicts the temperature of the year to follow: if Shavuot is hot, the rest of the year will be hot. The implication however, is that Shavuot more generally has a predictive quality, anticipating future outcomes. This Rosh Hashana aspect of Shavuot brings to mind another pair of shared customs. On Rosh Hashana, it is customary not to sleep during the day – some are particular to rise immediately upon dawn – so as to be on guard for the judgment in progress, as well as to avoid a precedent for a "sleepy" year. On Shavuot, somewhat chiasmatically, many don't sleep *at night* – to exhibit our eagerness to receive the Torah and our motivation to study it throughout the year.
